Statistics Request Overall Description

On October 30, 2025, Research and Statistics received a request for an aggregate report on capital eligible offenses disposed since 1/1/2025 and the sentence information for those charges disposed, statewide by County.

CourtNet, the database that provides a summary of cases statewide, was queried for capital charges (see supplemental list) that were disposed from 1/1/2025 – 12/1/2025 within Circuit Court (CR) cases statewide.

This report presents detailed statistical information regarding specified criminal offenses processed in Circuit Courts across the state. The analysis includes conviction outcomes and sentencing patterns for the specified period.

Sentence information is included only for the charges disposed which have a sentence entered. It does not represent the total sentence for the case or individual. Sentence lengths reflect only the jail or prison term assigned to each charge and do not account for concurrent or consecutive sentencing or any revisions resulting from shock probation/probation violations. Offenses with flag sentences (Life, Death, 25 Yrs No Parole) as indicated by checkboxes in the case management system are reported separately in a dedicated table.

Sentencing Information

CourtNet entries for the sentence of each charge may consist of the sentence imposed, along with any amount probated, suspended, and/or conditionally discharged, and/or sentenced to home incarceration.

Convictions of sentences with incarceration may be fully or partially suspended. When the total amount of sentence modifications is equal to the sentence imposed, the sentence may be considered fully suspended.

The amount of incarceration time sentenced is indicated as JORP (Jail or Prison). There are additional check boxes available to specifically indicate Jail and Prison, but these are not required, may not be used consistently, and no logical constraints restrict the use of these check boxes to given amounts of

incarceration time sentenced. Some prison incarceration sentences of greater than a year may be served in county jails.

Factors which affect the overall remaining sentence:

- When multiple sentences of imprisonment are imposed on a defendant for more than one (1) crime, the multiple sentence time intervals can be ordered to run concurrently or consecutively as determined by the court at the time of sentence. The concurrent/consecutive indicator does not distinguish the charge(s) or case(s) the sentence was ordered to be concurrent / consecutive with.
 - a. Concurrent Sentence: A sentence for a conviction that a court orders a defendant to serve simultaneously with the defendant’s sentence for a different conviction. A sentence may be fully or partially concurrent.
 - b. Consecutive Sentence: A sentence for a conviction that a court orders a defendant to serve only after he has discharged a sentence for a different conviction. A sentence may be fully or partially consecutive.
- There are additional checkboxes to capture conditional discharge time. These checkboxes are not taken into consideration within this report. These charges may be reported in the “other penalty” category.
- Probation violations involve conduct that violates any judicial order imposing supervision of a defendant. Violations of probation and supervised release may result in “Probation Revocation” which is the annulment, cancellation, or reversal of an act, with regard to probation or supervised release, the term generally refers to the judicial act of canceling the supervision in response to the offender violation the terms of supervision and impose a term of incarceration. Revisions to sentence penalties arising from probation violations are not reflected in the sentence-imposed portion of this report.
- Shock probation is a form of conditional early release from prison (before the full term of imprisonment expires). Upon violation of a parole condition, a parolee may be placed back in prison to complete the remainder of the sentence. (KRS 439.265)
- Set Aside/Vacated Sentence When a sentence for one or more charges is set aside or vacated, the sentence information is removed and can no longer be reported.
- Expungement of Conviction When one or more charges within a case is granted expungement, it can no longer be reported as the sentence information for these charges is removed as part of the expungement process.

Statistical Reports (25_RS3143)

The report provides seven (7) pages of data on capital charges disposed from 1/1/2025-12/1/2025 within Circuit Criminal (CR) cases.

NOTE: Revisions to sentence penalties arising from probation violations are not reflected in the sentence-focused portion of this report.

Page 1:

Cases are counted under each combination of Charge Disposition Category applicable to at least one charge within the case. This causes case subtotals to add up to a number larger than the actual overall total, the grand total has the actual overall total of cases.

Page 2:

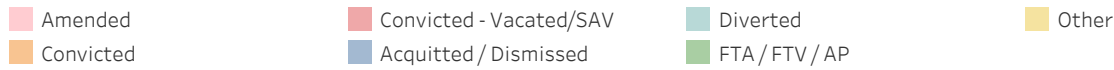


Figure 1: Capital Offenses by Charge Disposition Category, Statewide

Figure 2 displays a horizontal bar chart illustrating the same information as Figure 1, further broken down by Charge UOR Code and Description.

Page 3:

Table 2 presents the corresponding cross-tabulation to Figure 2, providing the same information in tabular format. Cases are counted under each combination of UOR Code and Charge Disposition Category applicable to at least one charge within the case. This causes case subtotals to add up to a number larger than the actual overall total, the grand total has the actual overall total of cases.

Pages 4-5:

Table 3 presents the same information as Table 1, breakdown by County.

Page 6:

Table 4 presents a cross-tabulation providing counts of charges by Sentence Imposed Time in Year groups (Less than 5 Years, 5-9 Years, 10-14 Years, 15-19 Years, 20-24 Years, 25+ Years and No Sentence). Convictions which have been vacated, sealed, voided, or set aside may no longer contain sentence information, therefore some may be counted under *No Sentence* group. Counts of distinct cases containing these charges are provided, and cases are counted under each Imposed Sentence Time group associated with an applicable charge within the case. This causes subtotals of case counts to add up to a number larger than the actual overall total. In this table, the grand total in the right column has the actual overall total of cases. Charges with flag sentences (Life, Death, or 25 Years No Parole) are excluded from this table.

Page 7:

Table 5 presents a cross-tabulation including counts of charges sentenced to *Life, Death, or 25 Years No Parole* (as indicated by checkboxes in the case management system), along with the number of distinct cases involving these charges.

Table 6 presents a cross-tabulation with counts of charges by Highest Penalty Imposed. Counts of distinct cases containing those charges are also included. Convictions that have been vacated, sealed, voided, or set aside may no longer contain sentence information and are therefore categorized under *No Sentence*. Because a sentence may include more than one penalty, each charge is classified according to the first applicable penalty within the following hierarchy:

- Other Alternative Penalty

Additionally, counts of charges with alternative conditions are also provided. Note that a single charge may have multiple conditions and is counted for under each applicable condition in the table. A list of possible alternative sentences can be found below. Alternative sentences with zero applicable charges are not shown in the table.

Statistical Analysis Considerations:

- These statistics represent a snapshot in time as of the date the data was queried.
- Counts of cases do not necessarily represent counts of unique individuals.
- The sentence information in this report represents only the sentence ordered for that *charge* and does not provide the overall punishment for the case or for the individual.
- Sentence time entered represents the sentence ordered by the court. Subsequent modifications by the Department of Corrections to the length of incarceration is not reflected in this report.
- A case may consist of one or multiple charges. The report’s count of cases represents a distinct count of case numbers, regardless of the number of charges within the case.
- The report may exclude sentence information for cases partially expunged – cases in which one or more charges but not all charges within the case have been expunged. This is because the Sentence information on the specific expunged UOR Code(s) within the case no longer exists and is removed during this expungement process.
- Charges include all ASCF Codes: 1-Attempt, 2-Solicitation, 3-Conspiracy, 4-Facilitation, 5-Complicity, and 6-Enhancement.

A query for data based on specified charges will include each UOR code specified and possible supplemental codes. Supplemental codes (or "ASCF" codes) to any UOR code include: 1) attempt, 2) solicitation, 3) conspiracy, 4) facilitation, 5) complicity, and 6) enhancement. In total, UOR codes contain seven digits. The first six digits are specific to that charge. The seventh digit indicates if there is a supplemental code. A "0" as the seventh digit means that is the primary UOR code and it does not have a supplemental code. If there are supplemental codes, the "0" will change to a 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, or 6 (the numbering corresponds to the list above). An enhancement does not exist on all UOR codes. When a supplemental code does not appear within a dataset, charge(s) did not occur during this period. The presence of "*obs" within the description of a UOR code indicates an obsolete UOR code. However, the code is still present within the KYCourts/CourtNet database and may still be utilized. Not every UOR code included in the query will have charges associated with it in each calendar year examined. Some cases may contain multiple charges; therefore, charge counts may exceed case counts. The number of cases cannot be inferred as the number of individuals as multiple cases may have the same defendant.

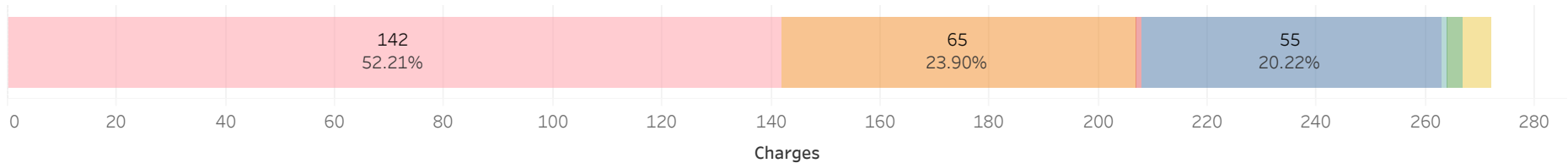

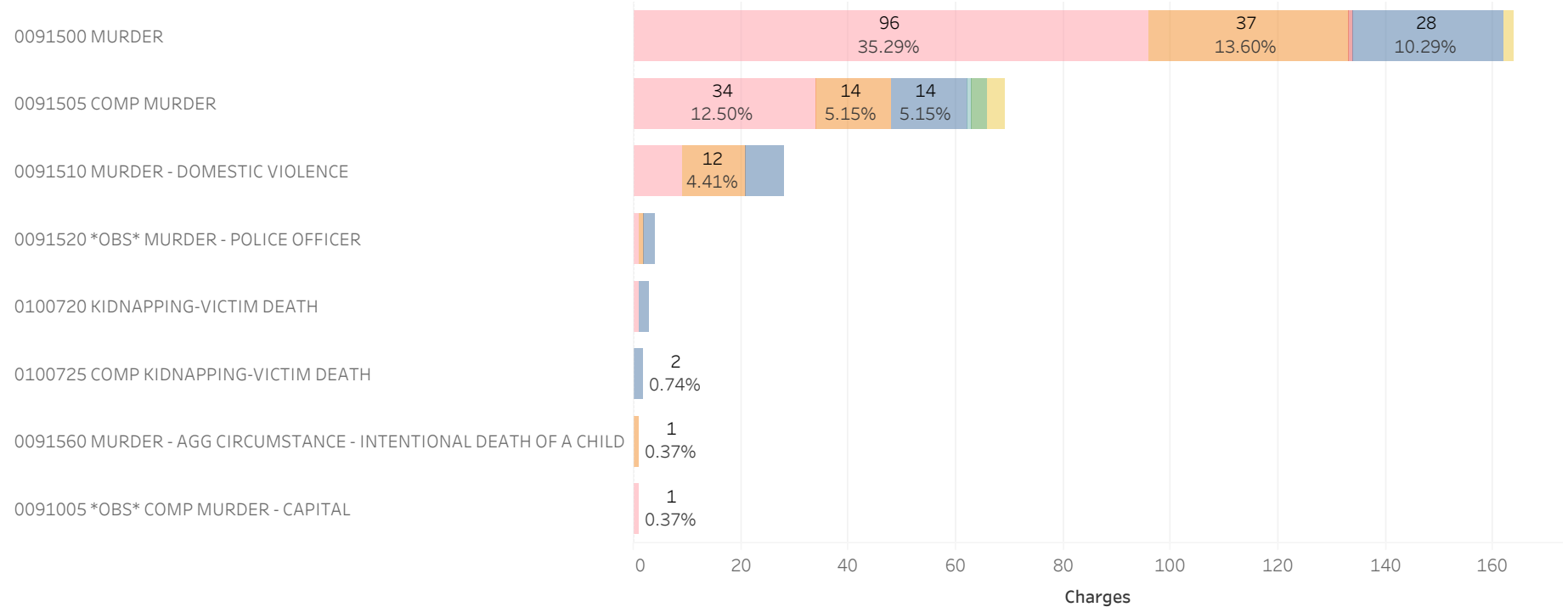
