EXPUNGEMENT DOCUMENTS ENTERED 1/1/2009 – 12/31/2021 STATEWIDE

July 11, 2022

Statistics Request Overall Description

On July 11, 2022, Research and Statistics received a request for a report on expungement documents entered between 1/1/2009 thru 12/31/2021.

CourtNet, which provides a summary of Kentucky court cases statewide, was queried for the specific document codes for the petitions and applications for expungement documents (PEXC, AFEX, PEXA, OAE, or PEX) which were entered within criminal cases January 1, 2009 through December 31, 2021 statewide. Those cases were then queried to check for an order granting/denying expungement documents (OFXG, OFXD, OEXG, OEXD, OG or OD) up until the date this report was generated, July 11, 2022. CourtNet was also queried for automatic expungement documents (OAE or DOE) entered statewide for the same timeframe.

1. Expungement for Felony Conviction

Expungement for class D felony convictions and executive pardons in KRS 431.073¹

The felony conviction expungement law (2016 HB40), which came into effect on July 15, 2016, created a process for the expungement of class D felony convictions and for offenses that receive executive pardons.

The felony conviction expungement process has three court documents:

- **AFEX** is used for the application for such expungements of felony convictions.
- **OFXG** is used when such expungements are granted
- **OFXD** is used when such expungements are denied

2. Expungement

Expungement of convictions for misdemeanor, violation and traffic infraction KRS 431.078² Expungement of charges acquitted or dismissed without prejudice 431.076(1)(b) and Expungement of felony charges in District Court not resulting in indictment 431.076 (1)(c)³

The process that allows petition for the expungement of conviction for certain misdemeanors or traffic violations and infractions (including dismissed or amended charges), for the expungement

of criminal offense charges acquitted or dismissed *without prejudice*, and for the expungement of felony charges in District Court not resulting in indictment.

- **PEXA** document applies to the expungement of a criminal charge that was not disposed as a conviction including felony charges in district court not resulting in indictment.
- PEXC pertains to expungement of a convicted misdemeanor, violation, or infraction.
- **PEX** prior code to PEXA and PEXC, may currently still be used erroneously.
- **OEXG/OEX** document is used to indicate the granting of either expungement petition.
- OEXD document is used to indicate the denial of either expungement petition.

3. Automatic Expungement

Automatic expungement process in KRS 431.076 (1)(a)⁴

The automatic expungement law (2020 HB 327), which came into effect on July 15, 2020, requires an automatic expungement of records upon the expiration of thirty (30 days) days after a court enters an order of acquittal of criminal charges against a person or enters an order dismissing with prejudice all criminal charges in a case against a person (not in exchange for a guilty plea to another charge), unless the person objects to the expungement. Traffic infractions not otherwise classified as a misdemeanor are not eligible for automatic expungement. A petition is not required by the person.

- OAE document is used when a charge is automatically expunged under KRS 431.076(1)(a).
- **DOE** document When a person objects to the automatic expungement process.

Statistical Table (22_RS3007

The statistical report provides counts of the expungement petition and order documents entered during the timeframe (1/1/2009 - 12/31/2021). Each table is sorted according to which expungement process is used (2016 HB40 Expungement, Automatic Expungement, or Other Expungement). Separate counts are provided for the total number of documents as well as the distinct number of cases.

Page 1 provides a statewide count for Circuit Court petition documents entered. (The automatic expungement process does not require the filing of a petition and will not appear in the count of petition documents.)

Page 2 provides a statewide count for District Court petition documents entered. (The automatic expungement process does not require the filing of a petition and will not appear in the count of petition documents.)

Page 3 provides a statewide count for expungements granted and denied in Circuit Court.

Page 4 provides a statewide count for expungements granted and denied in District Court.

- > The statistics presented in the attached tables are a snapshot in time, as of July 11, 2022.
- > The software used to record the filings of these document types does not contain any restrictions that the correct document type be used in relation to any given charge, and as such, some document types may be entered erroneously. For instance, many orders of OFXG or OFXD may be preceded by the petition used for the pre-HB 40 expungement process rather than the correct AFEX, leading to underreporting of petition documents. In other instances, an order granting or denying an expungement in a case may not be preceded by a petition document at all.
- When a case or charge is expunged, a process programmed within the software creates the appropriate 'expungement granted' document code. In some cases, this may result in duplicate entry when the documents are entered manually as well as processed automatically. For this reason, counts of granted expungements may be artificially high.
- A single expungement order of a felony conviction may apply to both a Circuit Criminal case and a District Felony case pertaining to the same defendant and incident.
