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Statistical Codes and Definitions: Case Types and Charge Dispositions Types

Case Types:

Case Type	Description
ABADMINISTRATIVE BOARD APPEALS	A petition for review of a decision of an agency, special district or board. It includes cases from such agencies as the Worker's Compensation Board and Public Service Commission, etc.
ADPTADOPTION	A petition to take a child (children) into one's family legally and raise as one's own child.
CACHILD ABUSE	An action involving a child whose health or welfare is injured or threatened with physical or emotion injury when his parent, guardian or other person does not provide the child with adequate care, supervision, food, clothing, shelter, education or medical care necessary for the child's well-being. (Obsoleted and replaced by Case Type CA April 2015.)[CM1]
COCONTRACT	An action based upon an agreement, upon sufficient consideration, between two or more persons to do or not to do certain things.
COMCOMMITMENT PROCEEDINGS	Involuntary hospitalization proceedings include the hospitalization of mentally ill and Intellectually Disabled adults.
CRCIRCUIT CRIMINAL	A crime punishable by death or imprisonment in the penitentiary.
DCTGDRUG COURT TRANSFER GUILTY	Used by receiving county, when case containing offense are disposed of as DCTG- Drug Court Transfer Guilty "guilty" and case has been transferred to another county.
DCTD RUG COURT TRANSFER DIVERSION	Used by receiving county, when case containing offense(s) are disposed of as "diversion" and has been transferred to another county.
DDPDENIED DOMESTIC PETITION	Civil proceeding for Denied Domestic Violence Petition.

DISDISABILITY PROCEEDINGS	Include adjudging a person fourteen years of age or older to be mentally or physically disabled to manage his/her affairs; determination that he/she is no longer mentally or physically disabled.
DPDEPENDENCY	An action involving a child, other than an abused or neglected child, who is under improper care, custody, control or guardianship, that is not due to an intentional act of the parent, guardian or person exercising custodial control or supervision of the child.
DVDOMESTIC VIOLENCE	Civil proceeding which allow victims of domestic violence to obtain short/long term protection against further violence.
EXEXPUNGED	To obliterate; to strike out.
FCLFORECLOSURE	A legal procedure by which a mortgage is foreclosed.
FDFORICBLE DETAINER	A district court case involving a landlord's
	repossession of his property from a tenant.
FEFELONY	A crime punishable by death or imprisonment in the penitentiary.
GCGUARDIAN/CONSERVATOR	A petition for the appointment of a new guardian/conservator.
IPINTERPERSONAL PROTECTION	Civil proceeding which allow victims of dating violence and abuse, stalking, and/or sexual assault to obtain short/long term protection against further violence and abuse, stalking, and/or sexual assault.
MIMISDEMEANOR	A crime less than a felony, punishable by fine or imprisonment in a local or regional institution rather than penitentiary.
NEGNEGLECT	An action involving a child whose health or welfare is injured or threatened with physical or emotional injury when his parent, guardian or other person does not provide the child with adequate care, supervision, food, clothing, shelter and education or medical care necessary for the child's well-

OTHOTHER	Indicates a civil case not specifically designated such as state fiscal suits, writ of prohibition, etc.
PAPATERNITY	An action taken to determine a child's father and set support payments.
PBPROBATE	Relates generally to the management of financial affairs of the person by another person. Contested wills are the jurisdiction of the circuit court. All other probate matters are handled in district court.
PDPROPERTY DAMAGE	An action arising from an injury to property which the plaintiff believes was caused by the defendant.
PIPERSONAL INJURY	An action based upon physical and/or emotional injuries which the plaintiff believes was caused by the defendant.
PRPROPERTY RIGHTS	Includes land title, right-of-way, and condemnation matters.
REVREVIEW OF TREATMENT	A petition for review or modification of treatment.
SGSEGREGATED	To separate or isolate from others or from a main body or group. (Only law enforcement records may be statutorily segregated. Court records are not records which may be segregated. York v Commonwealth, Ky. App., 815 S.W. 2d 415 (1991)).
SPSPECIAL PROCEEDINGS	All other cases in juvenile court, i.e.; mental health proceedings, petition for abortion, etc.
STSTATUS	An act or conduct which is declared by statute to be an offense, but only when committed or engaged in by a juvenile, and adjudicated only by a juvenile court, i.e.; running away, truancy.
TPRTERMINATION	Indicates termination of parental rights case.
TRTRAFFIC	A serious traffic offense for which a court appearance is mandatory.
URESAURESA/UIFSA- UNIFORM RECIPROCAL ENFORCEMENT SUPPORT ACT	Determination of paternity or enforcement of support ordered. Can be filed in district or circuit court.
XIAPPEAL CIVIL	A complaint to a court of higher jurisdiction of an injustice done or error committed by a court of lower jurisdiction, whose judgment or decision the court above is called upon to correct or reverse.
XRAPPEAL CRIMINAL	A complaint to a court of higher jurisdiction of an injustice done or error committed by a court of
