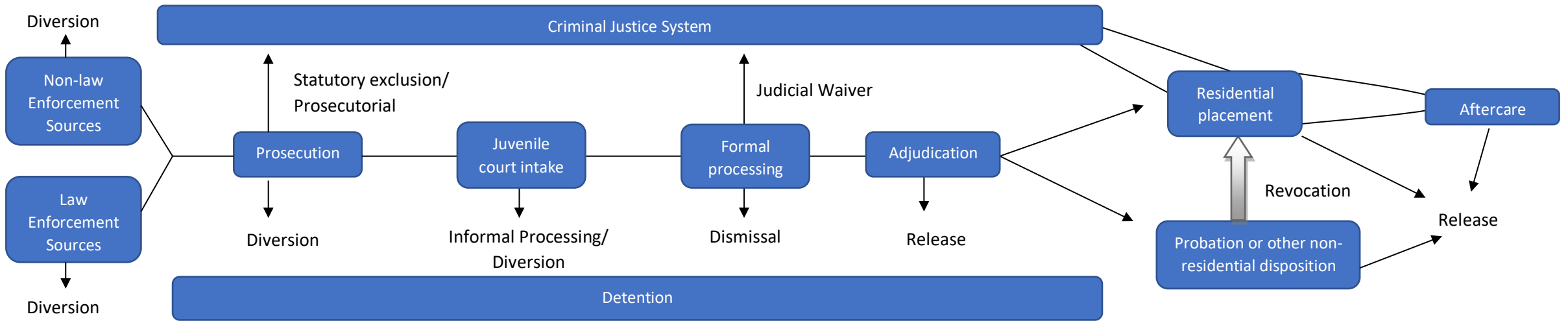
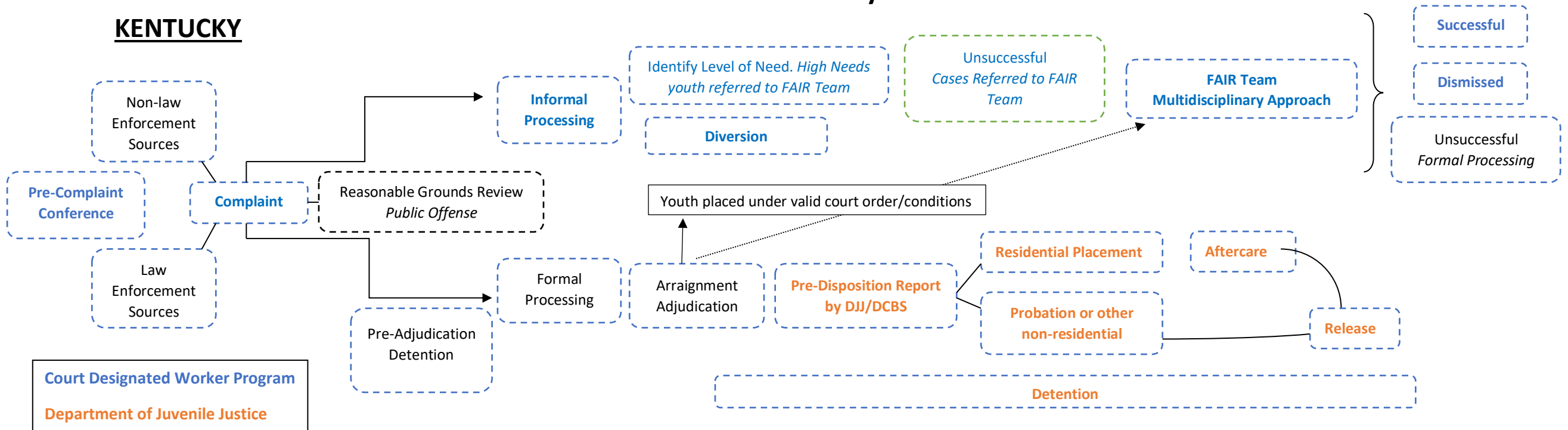

# Kentucky Performance Measures

<b>AOC Key Indicators</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Status offense pre-complaints and complaints</li> <li>• Public offense complaints</li> <li>• FAIR team referrals for status/public offenses</li> <li>• Court referrals for status/public offenses</li> <li>• Re-referral rates for diverted referrals and court referrals</li> </ul>
<b>DJJ Key Indicators</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Out of home standing population composition – youth disposed and detained</li> <li>• Admissions, releases and average length of stay in out of home placement for detained and disposed youth</li> <li>• Risk-adjusted recidivism rates for releases from out of home placement and community supervision</li> <li>• Annual budget and expenditure on out of home placement and community supervision</li> </ul>
<b>CHFS Key Indicators</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• DCBS investigations of referrals from FAIR team</li> <li>• Status offender commitments to DCBS</li> </ul>

<b>SB 200 Policy</b>	<b>Intended Outcomes</b>	<b>Performance Measures</b>
<b>Enhanced CDW process</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The CDWs will conduct evidence-based screenings for all referrals.</li> <li>• The enhanced CDW process will increase the number of successful pre-complaint case closures.</li> <li>• The enhanced CDW process will increase the number of successful diversions.</li> <li>• The enhanced CDW process will result in fewer status and public offense petitions and diversion overrides.</li> <li>• CDWs will receive training on assessment, family engagement and case management.</li> <li>• Fewer status and public offenders will have subsequent complaints after diversion.</li> <li>• The new CDW process will reduce length of time for successful completion.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Screenings conducted (breakdown for status/public offense referrals)</li> <li>• Pre-complaint case closure outcomes (successful/unsuccessful) for status offenders</li> <li>• Diversion outcomes (successful/unsuccessful) for status and public offenders</li> <li>• Status/public offense court petitions (breakout county attorney/judge diversion overrides)</li> <li>• CDW training completions</li> <li>• 1-yr re-referral rates for successful/unsuccessful pre-complaint case closures, diversions, referrals to court</li> <li>• Average length of time of diversion agreements (successful/unsuccessful diversions)</li> </ul>

<b>FAIR Team Review</b>	<p>The FAIR team review will enhance the CDWs' ability to help youth complete diversion. The FAIR team will help reduce the number of status and public offense court petitions.</p> <p>There will be increased collaboration between juvenile justice-involved agencies and service providers.</p>	<p>Status and public offense referrals to FAIR team (by region/CDW worker)</p> <p>Outcome of referrals reviewed (breakout DPP request/sent back to CDW/sent to court/sent to DCBS)</p> <p>Services available in FAIR team area (number/type of programs; program slots; etc)</p>
