**JUDICIAL ETHICS OPINION JE-88**

March 19, 1997

Issue: May a judge employ his son or daughter as a law clerk?

Answer: No. The son or daughter may assist the judge, but not in a formal capacity.

The question presented was whether a judge could employ his son or daughter, who was a recent law school graduate, as a law clerk. The Judicial Code of Ethics specifically prohibits nepotism. Canon 3B (4). For this reason, the Committee believes that it would be improper for a judge to use state funds to compensate a relative, even though the relative is otherwise qualified for the position.
